## **EVIDENCE AND INTERPRETATION**

Is the evidence credible and adequate to support the conclusions reached?

## Students will understand that:

- Evidence is information offered to establish a fact or support a position.
- Evidence can be found in primary or secondary sources.
- Whether or not we can trust evidence depends on its reliability
- The validity of evidence depends on whether it is used appropriately, and whether it is relevant to the questions being asked.
- Interpretations of evidence can be reasonable or unreasonable the latter if they extend beyond what the evidence itself can reasonably support.

Evaluate the use of evidence in each film. If evidence is found to be lacking, can you explain why?
